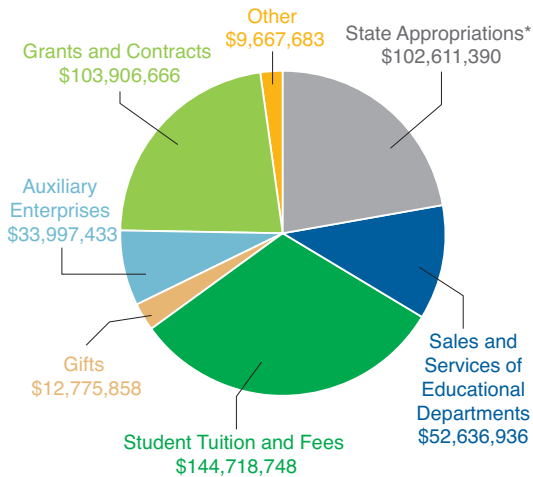


Research

UND attained a total of more than \$89.8 million in external awards in FY2019, including \$57.8 million in research awards. In FY2018, UND's research expenditures totaled \$109.9 million. Expenditures in the amount \$51 million were from federal sources including, but not limited, to the Department of Energy, National Institutes of Health, National Science Foundation and Department of Defense. UND research expenditures supported the training of hundreds of undergraduate students and approximately 230 graduate students in research projects across campus.

NDUS Report on Economic Impact

The University of North Dakota is the state's most comprehensive intensive research university and the primary center for professional education and training. It is one of approximately 55 public universities in the nation with accredited graduate schools of both law and medicine. According to a 2017 study, UND's economic impact on that state and region is \$1.5 billion. Levels of business activity resulting from UND expenditures supported 3,126 secondary (indirect and induced) jobs in FY2017. UND also exerts an economic impact through its students. Seventy-four percent of family medicine physicians practicing in North Dakota either graduated from the UND School of Medicine & Health Sciences or completed an in-state residency.* Additionally, UND has educated a significant number of the engineers and oil and gas experts working in the oil industry that is so critical to the state's economic health.
